Hi Sergey,

You might want to clarify what it is exactly that people would like to get out of an interface of TS with QT. QT's charting is outstanding and has many many features and it's trendline drawing is second to none. It's one of the best realtime charting packages I've ever used as far as it's versatility even though it's essentially free. Below is a screen shot of what my setup usually looks like. Sorry it's so big but it stretches across two screens.

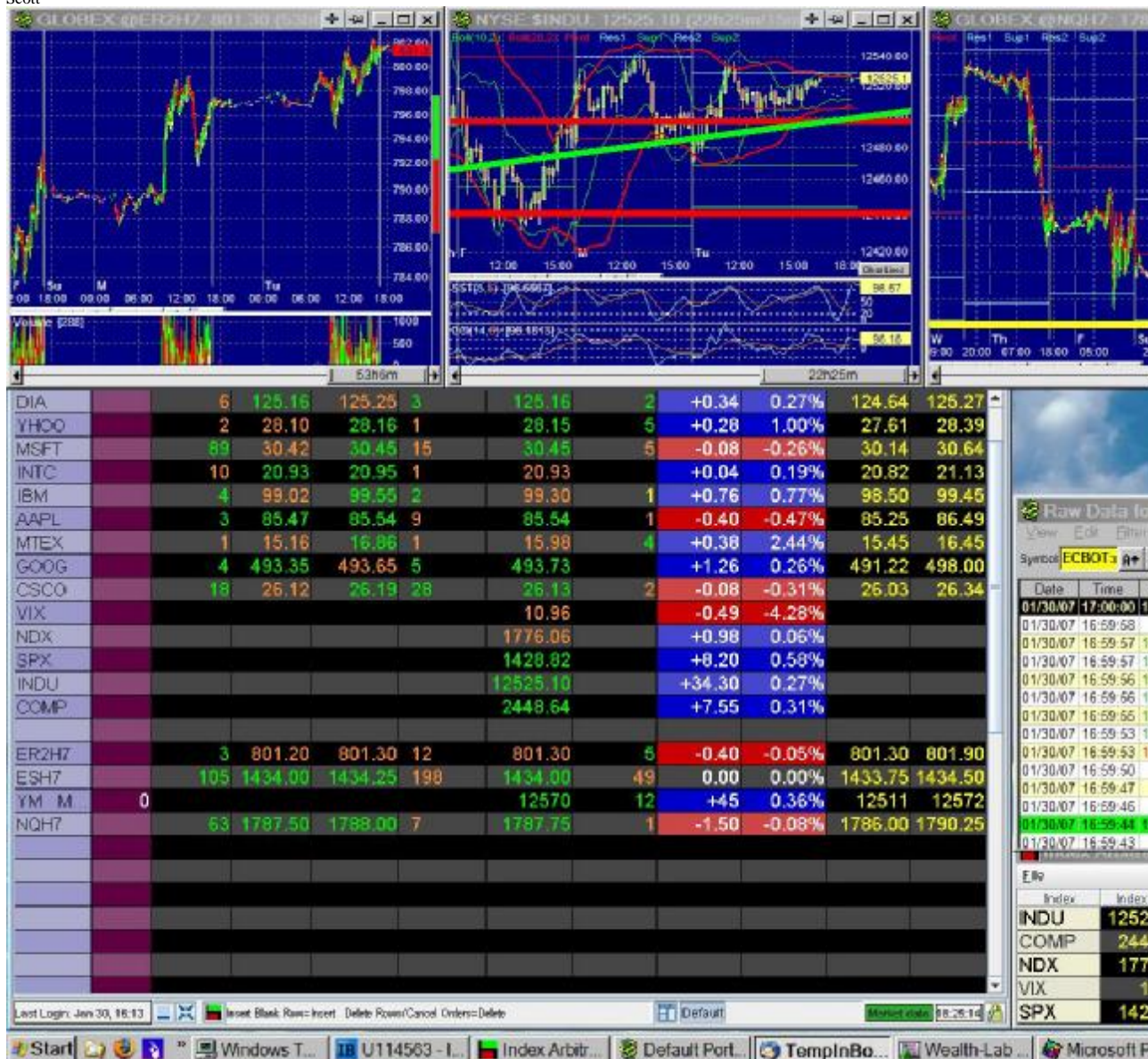
Anyways, I say you might want to clarify what people want because it may NOT be realtime charting so much as it is access to downloading and maintaining price data. As you can see in the screen shot, I have many charts open of different items on different timeframes and some show globex 24hrs and some show only regular exchange hours. QT is optimized to do all these things and that's it's main focus. TS's focus is different.

I can't speak for any others, but for me the best value would be an easy setup to maintain a list of stocks, futures, indices, etc. and be able to update their data thru QT. I currently maintain my data database inside of wealthlab and it has a pretty well thought out setup to do this. They are almost entirely different focuses; charting, database, and predictive techniques.

I would consider a limited realtime charting because it's hard to compete with QT. TS already does predictive techniques well. So that just leaves an easy to use and maintain price database.

That's my two cents worth. :-)
